The Logan First Presbyterian Church (FPC) Food Pantry has been listed as an official site by the Southeast Ohio Regional Food Bank and started distributing commodities in April 2022. Started years ago at the church, when the first Monthly Community Meals were being served, the pantry was stocked by donations and collection drives to help individuals and families who visited the church seeking help for food insecurity and other resources. The pantry went thru several changes as volunteers and staff addressed needs as the came about during the course of any given week.

During the pandemic that disrupted so many lives, the pantry was reorganized by dedicated members of the FPC and the decision as made to make the FPC a recognized food distribution site to answer the needs of the community.

The Pantry is open & staffed by volunteers the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month, 5 - 7 PM, plus by appointment.

Good Works, Inc. - A Community of HOPE

Celebrating 43 Years on January 1, 2024

The vision of Good Works is to create a community of HOPE with and for people who are struggling with poverty and homelessness in rural Appalachia. As a Christian community, we are seeking to grow in our love for God and for our neighbor. We offer contexts through which people in need can experience biblical hospitality, access practical assistance, and share their gifts with others. In doing so, we facilitate ways for people from all walks of life to build relationships of love and service with their neighbors. Along with other initiatives, we operate the **Good Works Timothy House**, which is currently the only shelter for people without homes in 8 Southeastern Ohio counties. We also serve Hocking County as requested by the Inspire Shelter.

- 2023 has been a good year for rebuilding after the COVID-19 pandemic. Many of our old structures which needed adjusted for the good of public health have been returned to the way they were in 2019.
- We have provided about **130,000 nights of shelter** over the last 40+ years.
- Our objective is to provide a safe, clean, stable, temporary place, yet
 homelike place for people to be while the residents work on the issues in their
 lives which led to the situation of homelessness.
- Each resident meets with a **Caregiving Team** weekly to build a trusting relationship, help them identify their goals, provide loving accountability, and connect them with services in the community.
- We have structured the Timothy House so that each resident is encouraged to take **responsibility and can maintain personal dignity**. For example, residents share responsibility for cleaning the house, fixing meals, and doing laundry.
- In 2023, Good Works completed the building of a new house to assist individuals with a physical disability who are experiencing a housing crisis and cannot use steps. This new initiative is located across the street from the Timothy House.
- In 2020, Good Works created a new fund-raiser to assist with the overall operational needs of the Timothy House called **DAY IN THE LIFE**. Combined with the gifts provided through the Good Neighbor Gift market in 2022, funding of about **100** days of shelter was provided.
- The Timothy House is **located in Athens within walking distance** to stores and potential work sites. The facility currently has 4 bedrooms with 15 beds, a living room, a kitchen, 2 bathrooms, 2 offices, and a large eating/meeting room.

What We Do

Many in our community are only one or two unexpected events away from losing stable housing, and this problem has only grown due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Hocking Hills Inspire Shelter provides necessary help to people experiencing homelessness in Hocking County. We offer shelter, food, and necessities to our clients while they work to obtain housing and employment. Since the opening of our new shelter in 2018, we have often been at or over capacity.

We have been fortunate enough to receive emergency grant funding during the pandemic, which has enabled us to operate 24/7 and keep our staff and residents safe. We would love to continue these extended hours, as we can better support our residents this way - however, our grant funding runs out after Christmas and it costs about \$550 per day to stay open 24/7. Welcome to Home Away From Home

Home Away From Home is a community based nonprofit organization dedicated to the recovery of people with mental illness by enhancing personal development and well being, and fostering community involvement. Participants help one another and receive support from staff and volunteers in handling the challenges of everyday living.

We serve a hot lunch every weekday. We are able to provide a space for people to do their laundry as well as bathing facilities. We have a fully stocked pantry and household closet to provide items to those who are in need. There are recreational, social, and vocational opportunities for those who are interested. We teach good physical and mental health habits, daily living skills, and basic life skills. Home Away From Home provides a safe place for people to socialize, all in a home-like atmosphere.

Participants strive to help make life better for each other as well as in the community. Members recently gathered and donated items for the local Humane Society. They gathered items from friends and neighbors and had a yard sale to help with the costs of running the activities of the house. We were able to grow a garden this year and provided much needed vegetables to other members in need. We look forward to welcoming new members to our home.

Hunger in Southeast Ohio

Food insecurity affects approximately 1 in 6 individuals in Southeast Ohio, including seniors, children, working adults, veterans, and students.

Rising food prices, the end of SNAP Emergency Allotments, wage stagnation, and underemployment have contributed to the increased need for emergency food services in the region. Individuals facing food insecurity often have to make difficult choices between food and other basic necessities like utilities, transportation, medicine, housing, and education.

The SE Ohio Foodbank works to end hunger in our region by providing emergency food assistance, resource navigation, and advocacy for policy changes. We also advocate for comprehensive strategies to tackle the root causes of food insecurity, including fair wages, affordable housing, accessible healthcare, and robust social safety nets.

Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels routes are covered 3 days a week where drivers deliver well-balanced meals to home-bound seniors. We view each program participant as a neighbor and friend. The Regional Kitchen carefully coordinates its meal preparation and delivery by taking into account the individual needs of each senior. Through the deliveries, seniors not only receive nutritious meals, but a safety and wellness check as many of our clients live alone and our driver may be the only person they see regularly.

We also offer monthly pet food delivery, thanks to our staff's hard work and dedication, along with the generosity of local donors. This keeps people and pets together, and healthy, by eliminating logistical and financial challenges. Our thanks goes out to Friendly Paws Pet Supplies & Grooming and White's Mill who support this effort.

The First Presbyterian Church (FPC) "Good Sam Program" helps families and households in crisis and partners with other organizations to fill the gaps needed to establish new utilities, prevent costly service interruptions, or secure resources not available from other sources. It is also available to help individuals, including residents at the Hocking Hills Inspire Shelter, needing resources necessary to establish and maintain needed items that supports work and housing start-ups.

This program is funded from money donated thru the Kroger Community Rewards program to FPC, interest payments from a dedicated CD donated by the late Lucy Shaw, budgeted mission funds from FPC, as well as individual donations. This program started in 1998 by Rev. Larry Hoffman. At the end of 2022, the fund has disbursed over \$102,165.04 to Hocking County families for help with housing stability, homeless prevention, and essential needs.

WESTMINSTER PRESCHOOL



And, a good early childhood education sets the tone for school successes to come.

The Preschool is a mission of First Presbyterian Church, and is licensed by the State of Ohio. Tuition money and the Church's support enable the program to operate, but it is through donations, that the program thrives. Scholarship assistance is available and butterflies emerge from chrysalises during the spring because of donations. Art materials and equipment can be replaced and upgraded with the use of donation funds.
