# Bottoms Up Diaper Bank

**Our primary goal is to promote good health and hygiene for children who lack access to essentials like diapers while also helping to alleviate concerns for their families who struggle to afford them.**

**Unfortunately, in the US, 1 in 2 families struggle to afford clean diapers for their children, and often, children will have to go without.**

**Established in 2018, Bottoms Up is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing fresh, clean diapers to families in need around Southeast Ohio. The average baby will need at least 6 diapers each day to stay fresh and clean.**

**Since 2018, Bottoms Up has distributed more than 6 million diapers to more than 80 food pantries and childcare facilities across 28 counties in Ohio.**

# **Dominican Village Mountain Mission**

**The Village Mountain Mission Project takes place on the northern coast of the Dominican Republic in the province of Puerto Plata on the north slope of the Cordillera Septentrional Mountain range. The**

**mission was created in 2004 to address the lack of suitable housing in rural communities of the Dominican Republic. The homes are durable, simple homes of a modest size. Crews from numerous states have participated, including churches, high schools, groups of friends, and colleges. Since the mission began, over one-hundred homes have been built. Approximately thirty Hocking County residents of all ages will be traveling to the mission in 2026.**

**In the past, the mission was primarily self-funded through participants' fees. Due to increasing costs in recent years, the need has arisen to seek donors for operational costs and house sponsorships. Partners volunteer to be part of a crew, make direct donations, and/or conduct fundraisers to benefit the mission. For more information, contact mission director Steve Dietz at**

# First Presbyterian Church's **Food Pantry**

*Open the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays of each month, from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m.*

The Food Pantry at the First Presbyterian Church of Logan was started in 2021 and has been growing ever since. The goal of the food pantry is to help provide food and other essential items, which helps some of our community neighbors through the month. Canned and packaged food products, along with various fresh and frozen items are available. In addition, we provide some cleaning and personal hygiene products, including infant and adult diapers. So far in 2025, on average, we handed out food boxes to 115 households per month.

Thanks to our partnerships, including the SE Ohio Food Bank, Bottoms Up Diaper Bank and 740 Rescue Kitchen, grants and generous donations from our congregation and community, this has allowed us to have the needed food and household products to hand out. The pantry is staffed entirely by our hard-working and supportive volunteers.



Hocking Hills Inspire Shelter is an ever-growing group of volunteers and community members that have recognized the need to provide those experiencing homelessness in Hocking County with an opportunity for a better life. HHIS has been a 501(c)3 since 2012, working diligently to provide residents with food and shelter while they work on obtaining housing and employment.

Many in our community are only one or two unexpected events away from losing stable housing, and HHIS exists to provide necessary help to the people who have found themselves in this situation. Since the opening of our 14-bed shelter in 2018, we have been consistently at or over capacity. By working with partner agencies, providing a mailing address, and providing shelter and vital supplies, HHIS assists residents in getting back on their feet when they need it most. Many of our residents tell us, "I had no hope, but you have given me hope."

# **Home** Welcome to Home away from **Away From Home** **Home**

**Home Away From Home** is a community based nonprofit organization dedicated to the recovery of people with mental illness by enhancing personal development and well being, and fostering community involvement. Participants help one another and receive support from staff and volunteers in handling the challenges of everyday living.

We serve a hot lunch every weekday. We are able to provide a space for people to do their laundry as well as bathing facilities. We have a fully stocked pantry and household closet to provide items to those who are in need. There are recreational, social, and vocational opportunities for those who are interested. We teach good physical and mental health habits, daily living skills, and basic life skills. Home Away From Home provides a safe place for people to socialize, all in a home-like atmosphere.

Participants strive to help make life better for each other as well as in the community. Members recently gathered and donated items for the local Humane Society. They gathered items from friends and neighbors and had a yard sale to help with the costs of running the activities of the house. We were able to grow a garden this year and provided much needed vegetables to other members in need. We look forward to welcoming new members to our home.

## Good Works, Inc. - A Community of HOPE

The vision of Good Works is to create a community of HOPE with and for people who are struggling with poverty and homelessness in rural Appalachia. As a Christian community, we are seeking to grow in our love for God and for our neighbor. We offer contexts through which people in need can experience biblical hospitality, access practical assistance, and share their gifts with others. In doing so, we facilitate ways for people from all walks of life to build relationships of love and service with their neighbors. Along with other initiatives, we operate the Good Works Timothy House, which is currently the only shelter for people without homes in 8 Southeastern Ohio counties. We also serve Hocking County as requested by the Inspire Shelter.

. Our objective is to provide a safe, clean, stable, temporary place, yet homelike place for people to be while the residents work on the issues in their lives which led to the situation of homelessness.

Each resident meets with a Caregiving Team weekly to build a trusting relationship, help them identify their goals, provide

- loving accountability, and connect them with services in the community.
- We have structured the Timothy House so that each resident is encouraged to take responsibility and can maintain personal dignity. For example, residents share responsibility for cleaning the house, fixing meals, and doing laundry.
- In 2024, Good Works completed the building of a new house to assist individuals with a physical disability who are experiencing a housing crisis and cannot use steps. This new initiative is located across the street from the Timothy House.
- The Timothy House is located in Athens within walking distance to stores and potential work sites. The facility currently has 4 bedrooms with 15 beds, a living room, a kitchen, 2 bathrooms, 2 offices, and a large eating/meeting room.

## Meals on Wheels

Food insecurity affects approximately 1 in 6 individuals in Southeast Ohio, including seniors, children, working adults, veterans, and students.

There are many reasons that have contributed to the increased need for emergency food services in our region. Individuals facing food insecurity often have to make difficult choices between food and other basic necessities like utilities, transportation, medicine, housing, and education.



The SE Ohio Foodbank works to end hunger in our region by providing emergency food assistance, resource navigation, and advocacy for policy changes. We also advocate for comprehensive strategies to tackle the root causes of food insecurity, including fair wages, affordable housing, accessible healthcare, and robust social safety nets.

### Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels routes are covered 3 days a week where drivers deliver ~~wellbalanced~~ meals to home-bound seniors. We view each program participant as a neighbor and friend. The Regional Kitchen carefully coordinates its meal preparation and delivery by taking into account the individual needs of each senior. Through the deliveries, seniors not only receive nutritious meals, but a safety and wellness check as many of our clients live alone and our driver may be the only person they see regularly.

We also offer monthly pet food delivery, thanks to our staff's hard work and dedication, along with the generosity of local donors. This keeps people and pets together, and healthy, by eliminating logistical and financial challenges. Our thanks goes out to Friendly Paws Pet Supplies & Grooming and White's Mill who support this effort.
